 - Also week of conferences
 - First Day of School Supplies Angella Sargent
 - Not a lot of participation
 - Varied by price
 - Didn't cost us anything

- Texas Roadhouse Gift Card Sales
 - October 7-27
 - Classroom competition for who can sell the most
 - Prizes for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place although everyone will receive a prize (free kid's meal)
 - Ideas for places bring in lunch, appetizers, etc. not final
 - Get 10% of value of total sold
 - Also have Dine & Donate December 5
 - Get 10% of sales that evening and you can use your gift cards and coupons (free kids meals) and you get the full value
 - Each person will get one envelope to take orders and receive cash; we give them back and she will place the order November 1. Mid-end November everyone will get them
 - Dine & Donate
 - $\circ~$ Panera Bread October 20 20% of sales
 - Rocky Rococo November 7 –10% of sales
 - Texas Roadhouse December 5 15% of sales
 - Culver's (inquire about Plymouth since different owners than Sheboygan)
 - Vendor Fair
 - Raffles for principal/vice principal of the day
 - Don't have a date yet because basketball schedule was just posted 9/13
 - Doesn't make a lot of money by itself but by selling raffles, food, having it during Scholastic, etc.
 - Stressful to coordinate all the vendors; would need more volunteers to help
 - Would recommend not offering lunch available during registration; offer food available day of; everyone on their own
 - Last year ordered book fair items earlier and sold during Vendor Fair before the book fair officially opened
 - \circ $\,$ Consider Junior's Eats as food option or Theo's Pizza
 - Gym is clear on Saturdays; setup in Cafe and then bring over to the gym when basketball leaves
 - Landed on 10/28, 8am-2pm
 - <u>Will not</u> have Book Fair in conjunction with vendor fair this year
- Wisconsin Herd
 - G level basketball team
 - 2 fundraising options
 - Family ticket night block seating; purchase tickets at discounted price
 - Fun activations included
 - Mascot could come to school
 - Propose last day of school
 - Just sell tickets and we get 20% of ticket price

- Holiday Shop
 - o Polar Pals
 - Allows the kids to shop for their people in "secret" things like cups, and "Best Mom" keychains, pens and trophies
 - We set the price point on the items so we determine the profit margin
 - Kids get a card sent home that comes back with the money on who they need to shop for and how much to spend
 - I have done this before, and we had volunteers that giftwrapped the items and dropped them back off to the students that same day and filled out the gift tags. I actually still have all the wrapping paper in my garage right now from it.
- Starla's Seasonings
 - Get 50% of sales; Seasonings are \$6 (\$3 profit); Beer Breads are \$10 (\$5 profit)
 - Separate order forms depending on what we want to offer
 - Kids would return completed slips and money and Ashley Pantel would place order and pickup
- Conference Day Snacks and drinks 11/2 & 11/9
 - Buy in bulk from Costco and sell individually
- Charleston Wrap
 - It's every school fundraiser but all at once, there is candy, candles, clothing, gift wrap, and other home accessories.
 - This was a good fundraiser in the past and raised \$3,300 in September 2021 and was only stopped because there was no volunteer to be the chairperson
 - o Kelly McCoy volunteered to take the lead this year
- Principal For the Day
 - o This usually is done during the vendor fair
 - Need volunteer to run it make a flyer, ticket, collect the raffle
